Whether you are new to service accreditation or not, we suggest that in putting together an application, you follow the following steps: Step 1: Contact person. Identify someone in your organisation who is going to be the BACP 'contact person' for accreditation purposes and who will be submitting your application.

### Service Accreditation Scheme - BACP

Apply for senior accreditation. Our application and assessment process. For senior accreditation you must demonstrate how you've developed your knowledge, experience and ethical practice in specialist areas since your initial accreditation. Application follows a similar format to your initial accreditation, requiring evidence of your practice, supervision and training, and a reflective practice section exploring your understanding of what you do.

BACP accreditation. A well-recognised and valued quality status for practitioners, services and training courses. BACP accreditation schemes aim to recognise the achievement of high standards of knowledge, experience and development in counselling and psychotherapy. They help clients, employers, practitioners and students to make an informed decision when choosing a therapist, service or training course.

Applying for individual accreditation How can you demonstrate your way of working in practice? For Criterion 9 we want you to provide case material to demonstrate your way of working in practice. You can either write about one client or up to two separate clients.

### Reflective practice criterion 9 - BACP

Can I apply for accreditation before I register? No - you'll need to become a registered member before you can apply for accreditation. You must also be in practice, seeing at least one client a month, and be receiving contracted supervision. Do I need to complete an accredited course to apply for accreditation? No, you don't need to complete an accredited course to apply for individual accreditation.

### FAQs about accreditation - BACP

BACBP is the lead organisation for cognitive and behavioural therapies in the UK. We provide practitioner accreditation for CBT therapists living and working in the UK and Ireland. Accreditation means that a CBT therapist has both core professional mental health training or recognised equivalent, as well as specific CBT training. To be accredited, our members must have applied and demonstrated that they meet high standards of training and experience in CBT .
