who, what, when, where. Body. – provides more detail about the event, in particular it answers the questions how and why. Quotes. – sometimes articles will include what a person (like an eye-witness or an expert) has said. These will be in speech marks. Photograph and caption.

Key features of a newspaper article - Primary Source

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The main features of writing a newspaper report (ks2) are: - Make sure the first sentence of your article sums up the most important part of the story to hook your reader and make them want to read more. - A newspaper article should always be written in the third person (he, she, it, they, them etc.) and in the past tense.
